Refugee Week from 16-22 June celebrates the resilience of those forced to leave their homes in search of safety. In mid 2024, it was estimated over 122 million people have been forced to leave their homes worldwide in search of safety. 68 million of these remain internally displaced within their own countries while 38 million are refugees and over 8 million people seek safety or asylum in other countries. Most of these people seeking refuge or asylum, over 70%, stay close to their countries of origin while just five countries host a third of refugees and people seeking asylum;, Colombia, Germany, Iran, Turkey and Uganda.

Like all of us, refugees and people seeking asylum have rights, needs and dreams. Refugee Week aims to mobilise both political will and community support to help people not only survive but thrive. The theme for this year's Refugee Week is "Community

as a superpower". Communities can bring people together, bridge divides and offer support. We see this every day in our schools, workplaces, sports clubs and family resource centres, to mention but a few, where a smile or an act of kindness can help people feel they are part of the community and they belong.
