Niamh Fitzpatrick will be our guest speak for the evening, bringing together her personal experience of grief and her professional expertise as a psychotherapist. Niamh has degrees in Psychology, Clinical Psychology, and Sport Psychology and is a regular speaker with Zeminar, Shona.ie, Let's Talk Mental Health at Work, Network Ireland, the Psychological Society of Ireland, and The Irish Hospice Foundation.

She will share her learnings and insights as she navigates her own experience of grief, having suffered a traumatic loss in March 2017, when her sister, Capt. Dara Fitzpatrick, was one of the four crew killed when Irish Coast Guard rescue helicopter Rescue 116 crashed while out on a mission. This session may be especially beneficial for parents seeking to understand their children's unique perspectives on grief, and those navigating traumatic or sudden losses. In Rome on October 1st 2025, Pope Leo addressed the "Raising Hope" Conference, celebrating the 10th anniversary of Laudato Si'. He said: "It is my hope that the upcoming international summits of the United Nations - the 2025 Climate Change Conference (COP

30)... will listen to the cry of the Earth and the cry of the poor, families, indigenous peoples, involuntary migrants and believers throughout the world... There is no room for indifference or resignation."

On Saturday November 15th, as world leaders gather at COP30 in Brazil, the world rises against Fossil Fuel Power. From every corner of the globe, people will gather to demand an end to the era of fossil fuels. COP30 in Brazil must be a turning point - ten years on since Paris, our leaders have to act It has never been more crucial to take action on climate change to stop all out climate chaos.

We need to join together demanding that the Government deliver faster and fairer climate action. Trócaire & the Laudato Si' Movement Ireland network will join with the Dublin City Interfaith Forum under the banner of 'Faiths For Climate Action', alongside other civil society organisations for the National Climate Demonstration on:

Saturday November 15th, gathering at 12:30pm for prayer

Garden of Remembrance walking to Leinster House. Save the date.

As Church, we can shine as a beacon of light for others. Here is how you can respond to the calls of Laudato Si' to listen to the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor at this time:

Pope Leo XIV: "God will ask us if we have cultivated and cared for the world that He created, and if we have taken care of our brothers and sisters. What will be our answer?"

The Bishops of Ireland have expressed their collective support for the joint Trócaire and *Laudato Si'* Working Group (LSWG) campaign for the Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty.

On behalf of LSWG. Bishop Martin Haves said. "Emissions due to the use of fossil fuels have been identified as the main driver of the climate crisis. Despite commitments by Western governments to reduce the extraction of oil, gas and coal from the Earth, the fossil fuel multinationals continue to expand their plans for further exploration. It means that countries and companies continue to approve and fund new fossil fuel projects. "While the 2015 United Nations Climate Change Agreement in Parish (COP21) agreed on a limit of 1.5 degree Celsius, it does not mention fossil fuels as the main driver of the rise in global climate temperatures. Therefore, the need for a binding commitment to end the expansion of new coal, oil and gas projects – and to accelerate a global transition away from fossil fuels, i.e. a global Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty - is urgent."
